The desired certificate (in continuation of certificate no. F.2(3)AH/2003 pt-I Dated 06.06.2018, issued by this department) is as follows:-

1. Number of Veterinary colleges or institutions already existing in the State :- 07 (03 Constituent Colleges of RAJUVAS BIKANER and 04 PRIVATE Colleges Affiliated to RAJUVAS BIKANER)
2. Number of seats available or no. of veterinary doctors graduating annually :- 560 (80 X 7)
3. Number of veterinary practitioners registered with the State Veterinary Council :- 3470
4. Number of veterinary practitioners in Government service :- 3247
5. Number of government posts lying vacant for veterinary practitioners :- 1265
6. Number of government posts in rural or difficult areas for Veterinary Practitioners :- Scheduled and Desert Area Districts Namely- Dungarpur, Banswara, Pratapgarh, part of Bikaner & Sirsihi (TSP Areas of Tribal Districts) and Saharia area of Baran District are difficult areas for Veterinary Practitioners and similarly districts like-Jodhpur, Jaisalmer, Bikaner, Bikaner and Churu (Desert Districts) are also very difficult areas for Veterinary Practitioners.
7. Number of veterinary practitioners registered with Employment Exchange :- This type of information is not maintained by the department.
8. Veterinary practitioners to animal population ratio presently in the State :- 1:14301 (approx)
9. Veterinary practitioners to animal patient ratio presently in the State :- 1:7396 (approx)
10. Veterinary practitioners to animal patient ratio proposed to be achieved by the State :- As per the recommendation of National Commission of Agriculture report 1976, there is one veterinarian on 5000 cattle head.
11. How the establishment of the Veterinary College would resolve the problem of deficiencies of qualified veterinary practitioners in the State and improve the availability of such veterinary manpower in the State:-  
For providing optimum breeding, feeding and management services to our elite animals in the State. There are 07 Veterinary Colleges in operation that produce around 560 Veterinarians. The number of produced Veterinarians annually seem to be inadequate in the State as compared to population of animals in the State.
12. The restrictions imposed by the State Government Administration, if any, on student who are not domiciled in the State Government from obtaining admission in the State, be specified :-  
The candidate having Rajasthan State Domicile are eligible for admission on the state quota seats fulfilling the eligibility condition of RPVT exam.
13. Full justification for establishing the proposed Veterinary College :-

The most potentials alternative sources of food is from animal husbandry sector. India has the highest number of Livestock population in the world but the production of the milk is very less as compared to livestock population. The government of India has given emphasis to species wise animal research centers in order to conserve species and to obtain high productivity. Veterinary Institutions that produces competent and qualified veterinarians is inadequate to meet out the demand of human resources. It is possible only when large no. of veterinary colleges are available that produce veterinarians responsible for:-

- (i) Preservation and conservation of germplasm of indigenous animals.
- (ii) Animal health care and disease control.




(iii) Breed improvement and extension activities to farmers.

The President, Srimati Umila Devi Mahagaya Paropkari Trust, Bhurtpur, (Rajasthan) has applied for establishment of a Veterinary College in the name of Mahatma Gandhi Veterinary College, Bhurtpur, (Rajasthan). On careful consideration of the proposal, the Government of Rajasthan has decided to issue an essentiality certificate to the applicant for the establishment of a Veterinary college with 80 No. of seats.

It is certified that :-

1. The applicant has submitted concern/undertaking that the applicant would own and manage Veterinary Clinical Complex (VCC) and Instructional Livestock Farm Complex (ILFC) as specified in the Minimum Standards of Veterinary Education Regulations which were established in year 2016, prior to the inspection of VCI team.
2. It is desirable to establish a Veterinary College in the public interest.
3. Establishment of a Veterinary College in the name of Mahatma Gandhi Veterinary College at Bhurtpur, (Rajasthan), by President, Srimati Umila Devi Mahagaya Paropkari Trust, Bhurtpur, (Rajasthan) is feasible.
4. As per concern/undertaking submitted by the applicant, adequate clinical material as per the Veterinary Council of India norms would make available with the applicant, prior to the inspection of VCI team.

It is further certified that in case the applicant fails to create infrastructure for the veterinary college as per the rules framed time to time by the Central Government and the regulations framed by the Veterinary Council of India, as a result of which the permission for taking fresh admission is withdrawn by the Central Government, the State Government shall fully cooperate in shifting the students already admitted in the existing Veterinary College to recognized Veterinary College of the State.

In compliance of Government of India, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying letter No. K-12052-9/3/2019/LH (E-17359) dated 30.12.2021 and the recommendation of the Inspection Committees and Dean and Faculty Chairman, CVAS, Bikaner, Provisional Affiliation to the **Mahatma Gandhi Veterinary College, Bharatpur (run by Smt. Urmila Devi Mehgaiya Paropkari Trust, Bharatpur)** for the year 2022-23 is granted with the condition that college shall ensure fulfillment of the requirement as per VCI norms.

The provisional affiliation is exclusively for academic purpose subject to the terms and conditions laid down by the University and shall also be subject to review by the university and fulfilling the norms of VCI.

**Conditions:**

1. The remittance of annual affiliation and other fees, as communicated by RAJUVAS, Bikaner shall be made.
2. It shall be the sole responsibility of the concerned institute to fulfill VCI norms in stipulated time to avoid penalty, stopping of admissions, internship or cancellation of affiliation etc.
3. The affiliated college has to comply with university instructions meticulously.
4. No students shall be admitted without permission of Govt. of India/ VCI and RAJUVAS, Bikaner.

Affiliation of above mentioned college or institution includes recognition of such college by this University as per the provisions of Sec. 12(A) of the UGC Act, 1956 which are reproduced below:

**Section 12A (1)**

- (a) "affiliation" together with its grammatical variations, includes, in relation to a college, recognition of such college by, association of such college with, and admission of such college to the privileges of, a University;
- (b) "college" means any institution, whether known as such or by any other name which provides for a course of study for obtaining any qualification from a University and which, in accordance with the rules and regulations of such University, is recognised as competent to provide for such course of study and present students undergoing such course of study for the examination for the award of such qualification."
